# PROPOSITION NO. 1: BUDGET PROPOSITION

Shall the Fulton City District Board of Education be authorized to expend the sum of \$79,129,000 as a general fund appropriation for the 2022–2023 school year and to levy the necessary tax therefore?

#### PROPOSITION NO. 2: STUDENT TRANSPORTATION VEHICLES

Shall the Bond Resolution adopted by the Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Fulton authorizing the purchase of two (2) wheelchair buses for school transportation, including related furnishings and equipment incidental thereto, at a total estimated cost not to exceed \$145,000, and the payment of the costs of the buses by the levy of a tax upon all the taxable real property of the District in the amount of \$145,000 which tax shall be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education and, if necessary, in anticipation of such tax the issuance of bonds and bond anticipation notes in the principal amount not to exceed \$145,000 and the levy of a tax to pay the interest on said obligations, be approved?

#### PROPOSITION NO. 3: LIBRARY TAX PROPOSITION

Shall the Fulton Public Library Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and collect an annual tax, separate and apart from the annual school district budget, in the amount of \$470,041 (which is an increase of \$22,657 from the \$447,384 levy currently in existence) for the continuing support and maintenance of the Fulton Public Library, with this appropriated amount to be the annual appropriation until thereafter modified by a future vote by the taxpayers of the Fulton City School District?



Dear FCSD Community Members,

I hope this correspondence finds you and your family well! The past two years have been challenging for all, with every member of our learning community being impacted

in unique and different ways. I want to express gratitude to our students, families, faculty, staff, administrators, agency partners and our entire community for your perseverance and flexibility. We are observing and addressing increased academic and social-emotional needs of our students on a daily basis. We have stayed focused and reinforced our work in early literacy and instruction, multi-tiered systems of academic and social-emotional support, communication systems and innovation. Work with respect to career and college readiness continues to expand. Examples include our two Early College High Schools (Information Technology & Health Professions), upgrades to our technology wing at the high school, job fairs with local companies, and graduation pathways experiences beginning in elementary school. I am pleased to share with you the Board of Education adopted the budget for the 2022-23 school year. On Tuesday, May 17, 2022, residents of the Fulton City School District will have the opportunity to vote on the budget for the 2022-23 school year. I encourage all registered voters in our school district community to participate in this important process.

The proposed budget takes into consideration present and anticipated student needs, ensuring program and resource sustainability and capacity as part of three-to-five-year budget forecasting and local/state/national inflationary impacts on daily business. The 2022-23 budget aligns with and supports the Fulton City School District 5-Year Strategic Coherence Plan which clearly outlines our district's goals and strategies to achieve our vision and mission and to ensure coherence in everything we do. The framework of the plan directs us toward: Focusing the direction of the district; Developing a collaborative culture; Deepening our learning; and Securing accountability in all aspects of the organization. Areas of concentration in the plan are: Leadership; Literacy; Instruction; Social-Emotional Developmental Health; Family Engagement; and Innovation. Reports with respect to each component of the plan can be found on the District website. Development of the proposed 2022-23 budget began in November 2021 with input gathered through presentations at Board of Education meetings and workshops, feedback from a FCSD stakeholder Budget Committee, updates with and feedback from school site-based decision-making teams, updates/reports in our BoardDocs which is located in the Board of Education section of the District website, and on the dedicated "Budget" section on the FCSD website.

The proposed budget of \$79,129,000 was adopted by the Board of Education on April 19, 2022. It includes a spending increase of

3.8% or \$2,899,000 over the current year's budget. The FCSD 2022-23 balanced budget has been designed based on a 6.19% increase in NYS Foundation Aid of \$2,266,716 and \$108,882 planned use of FCSD Fund Balance. The FCSD 2022-23 budget proposal also includes a 2% change in the FCSD tax levy, which is the total amount of revenue that is raised through taxation from all property owners in the district to fund the school budget. Therefore, the overall total tax revenue collected will increase to \$22,045,571. If approved by voters, the budget would result in a 2% increase in the tax levy. Since the proposed tax levy is within the state tax cap, residents who have registered for the STAR exemption should receive a portion of their tax refunded by New York State in the fall of this calendar year.

Additional propositions for a vote are:

- Authorization for the purchase of two (2) wheelchair buses for transportation;
- Two members to the Board of Education;
- Authorization of a \$470,041 Fulton Public Library Tax Proposition; and
- Three members to the Fulton Public Library Board.
  The proposed budget maintains and ensures high-quality instructional programs, student support services and extra-curricular opportunities that will position students to be prepared for a complex and ever-changing world. Student and staff safety continue to be our highest priority, and work on our Capital Improvement projects continue to provide upgrades at each of our schools. We also continue to explore ways to utilize the benefits of being a part of the BOCES through purchasing and leasing, which results in maximizing dollars and available resources.

The proposed 2022-23 budget directs 74.8% of funds to student instruction, services and programs. The capital and debt portion of the budget makes up 14.8% while administration the remaining 10.4%. State aid will provide 70.0% of the revenue, the local tax levy providing 27.9%, planned use of reserves and assigned fund balance and other revenues contributing 2.1% of support. What is the impact of federal stimulus funds on the FCSD? The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSA) coupled with the American Rescue Plan (ARP) combined a one-time allocation of \$14,453,105 that is considered "special aid" and supplemental in nature. The federal funds are not to be utilized to supplant general fund expenditure. Allowable uses of these funds are defined and there is an associated application process for acquisition. Plans and reports for each of the allocations can be found on our website and have been highlighted throughout the budget process.
