Nearly 1.4M in Scholarships Awarded to GRB students

The annual G. Ray Bodley High School awards ceremony provided several students with the collective scholarship and monetary assistance up to nearly \$1.4 million in support of their educational dreams.

A first-of-its-kind virtual event, the traditional ceremony was divided into three nights to announce book award and scholarship winners, department honors and the top 25 students of each class.

GRB Principal Donna Parkhurst said the recognized students have not only excelled in their knowledge, they also have become leaders in their community.

"Our students and honorees have distinguished themselves as role models for their peers because of their character, work ethic and talents," she said. "The staff at G. Ray Bodley High School have observed them on the fields and courts, on the stage, and in the classroom dedicating themselves to consistently doing their best. On behalf of the staff and administration, I wish to thank you and your family members for bringing pride to G. Ray Bodley High School and to the Fulton community. We wish you continued success."

GRB administration then announced several students who received accolades for their leadership, dedication, academic achievement, character, perseverance and community service. For their efforts, recipients earned either a book, monetary award or scholarship commitment.

Dear FCSD Families & Community Members,

Thank you for the honor and privilege of serving the Fulton City School District. As I reflect on the 2019-20 school year, I am so proud of the work and accomplishments by our students, teachers, administrators, staff, parents, and community

partners. This year has been unlike any before with the impacts of COVID-19 pervasive across all aspects of our lives. I want to personally thank you for your flexibility, support, perseverance, and understanding during these fluid times.

As you are aware, there are many discussions about school reopening occurring in our community and across the country.

We miss our students and families, and we all look forward to a time when we can be together again in school. However, our highest priority is ensuring the safety of all members of our school community. We know that school will not look the same as it has in years past. As we plan for the 2020-2021 school year, we will communicate information as soon as we receive it.

NYS has provided school districts with the guidelines we need in order to develop plans for three possible varieties of reopening:

- · In-person school for all students
- A "hybrid" model that combines in-person school with remote learning
- Remote learning only

By July 31st, each New York State school district is required to submit its own version of each of these three plans. The input from parents, students, faculty, administration, and community members will be critical as we develop the FCSD plan. Information and thoughts will be collected through surveys, focus groups, national and state guidance, work with other regional school districts, and knowledge learned by holding the special education extended school year program in accordance with NYS parameters.

During the first week of August, Governor Cuomo has committed to making a decision on if, when, and how New York State's schools will reopen. We will keep you informed throughout the summer with respect to progress towards opening day.

We look forward to collaborating with you to ensure that we develop plans that meet the needs of our students, families and community, while also meeting NYS Department of Education and public health guidelines. Our goal is to hold focus groups and share a series of surveys to gather thoughts and feedback throughout the process design through implementation and ongoing throughout the year to monitor our progress. Thank you for your ongoing support and dedication to the success of every child in our school district.

I look forward to the 2020-21 school year and our future accomplishments for every child, every day! Have a safe and enjoyable summer!
