#### **LETTER FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT**



Dear FCSD Community Members,

I hope this correspondence finds you and your family well! The past three months have impacted each one of us in different ways. Some of the most far-reaching impacts have been economic - at the global, national and local levels. We know families have been experiencing this financial

uncertainty, too. With this in mind, I worked with the Board of Education and my team to craft a budget for the 2020-2021 school year that will help to ensure our students get the education they need and deserve, while being mindful of the economic realities of our community.

The FCSD 2020-21 budget has been designed in a very different world as the result of COVID-19. The proposed budget of \$73,777,000, adopted by the Board of Education on May 19, 2020, includes a spending increase of 0.58% (.0058) or \$423,000 over the current year's budget.

Over 68% of the FCSD revenues are from state aid. NYS State Foundation Aid to the FCSD for 2020-21 is unchanged from 2019-20 levels. This flat state aid funding, coupled with increased costs, resulted in a revenue gap of \$2.5 million for the 2020-21 budget. To address the revenue gap, expenditure reductions of \$2,048,000 were identified after a review of all departments. Adjustments were made to reflect changes in our student enrollment and maximizing cost-savings through BOCES shared services. The spending plan also eliminates 8.5 positions through retirements, resignations, and repurposing of positions.

In addition to voting on the budget, voters will consider:

- Election of three candidates to the Board of Education
- Authorization for the purchase of two student transportation vehicles
- · Selection of one Fulton Public Library Board member

**How does this budget proposal affect my taxes?** The tax rate is based on the overall assessed value of the property in the city and towns and the equalization

rate for each specific municipality. Equalization rates are set by the NYS Office of Real Property Services and are published in late July or August. However, it is anticipated that with no changes in the total assessed value of the community, a homeowner who resides in a home assessed at \$100,000 will pay approximately \$35 more next year in annual school taxes after the Basic STAR Exemption is applied. The tax rate per thousand would increase by \$0.505 or 1.88% for next year if this budget is approved.

The budget maintains curricular programming, social-emotional supports, and avoids reductions in credit bearing courses It was developed with input gathered through presentations at BOE meetings and workshops. Updates in the budget development process are in BoardDocs, which is located in the Board of Education section of the district website (www.fultoncsd.org).

What is a contingency budget? If the voters do not approve this budget on June 9th, the District Board of Education has determined it will adopt a contingent budget. Costs and time constraints will prevent the district from holding a second vote through absentee ballots. Adopting a contingent budget prohibits a district from spending money in certain areas, such as community use of facilities, unless all costs are reimbursed to the district, most equipment purchases, maintenance unless safety is at stake, and certain field trips and educational supplies. The rules for contingent budgets now require a zero percent cap on the tax levy. The contingent budget, would be \$73,532,000, which is a .24% increase over the current budget. As funding levels for New York state and federal aid programs are determined, funding for schools may change. Some estimates indicate that schools in NYS could face additional aid reductions of up to 20% as a result of revenue shortfalls.

In closing, I want to assure you that the proposed budget provides high quality instructional programs, student support services, and extra-curricular opportunities that will position students to be prepared for a complex and ever changing world.

#### **PROPOSITION NO. 1: BUDGET PROPOSITION**

Shall the following resolution be adopted: RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Fulton City School District is hereby authorized to expend the sum of \$73,777,000 as a general fund appropriation for the 2020-2021 school year and to levy the necessary tax therefore?

#### **PROPOSITION NO. 2: STUDENT TRANSPORTATION VEHICLES**

Shall the Bond Resolution adopted by the Board of Education authorizing the purchase of two (2) passenger vans for school transportation, including related furnishings and equipment incidental thereto, at a total estimated cost not to exceed \$73,000, and the payment of the costs of the Project by the levy of a tax upon all the taxable real property of the District in the amount of \$73,000 which tax shall be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education and, if necessary, in anticipation of such tax the issuance of bonds and bond anticipation notes in the principal amount not to exceed \$73,000 and the levy of a tax to pay the interest on said obligations, be approved?





- Be a resident of the District for a period of at least 30 days prior to the day of the vote
- Who is not otherwise ineligible to vote under the provisions of section 5-106 of the Election Law
