COVID Discussion/Q&A- Chris Ells

- Quarantine #s have decreased. An increase in the number of vaccinated people is helping. Also, the 5-day quarantine is another factor.
- We have MANY tests available to families and staff. We want to be sure families have them so testing can occur before our return from Winter Break.
- NYS Governor has extended Mask Mandate in schools until at least Feb 21st.
- Discussed continued frustrations around monitoring, especially at sporting events.
- If the mask mandate is lifted in schools, who makes the local decision for us?
 - We will follow the NYS mandates and guidance.
- Elementary students are still eating in classrooms. Reason being, limits risk for quarantine.

Budget Overview

- Are we still in jeopardy of not receiving transportation aid relief?
 - Although we have not received a definitive answer, we have not lost transportation aid.
- Discussed current retirements and potential staffing for next year. Included in this
 conversation were ways in which we are beginning to approach instruction in our elective
 areas (interdisciplinary project- Food Trailer). We also discussed the new iRacing
 initiative (eSports Club) that integrates engineering.
 - FCS- In addition to food & nutrition, we need to integrate the fashion industry, interior design, clothing production and entrepreneurship.

<u>20-week data</u>- Looked at passing data by grade level, department and subgroup. We also discussed the impact that "Incomplete" grades have on the passing rate.

Academic

- Why are 16% of students failing in PE?
 - If you are absent, you have to make up that time in PE. Given our challenges with absenteeism/interrupted attendance, it is a challenge for students to physically make up this time.
 - 1. This team recommends we look at alternative ways to meet PE requirements.
- Why are 22% of students failing Art?
 - We need to look at the impacts on grading/averaging.

Behavior

- When kids are skipping class, where are they?
 - The bathroom, hallway, cafeteria, other classrooms.
 - Added impact- On a typical day, we have 10 subs in the building. Students tend to take advantage of subs.
- Why are there so many referrals for Art?
 - Mainly skipping class.

Attendance

- Does that date include quarantines?
 - No, just absences (unexcused & excused).

School Culture

 I wonder if there is a connection between the number of students failing and the responses to the SEL question.

Other

- We are partnering with Fulton Parks & Rec to bring IRacing to GRB.
 - Eventually they would like to create a community IRacing Team that would use our equipment.
- How are the plans for Prom & Graduation going?
 - We are in the planning stages now.
 - o Prom is at Curtis Manor in Oswego and Senior Ball is at Bayshore.
 - o Graduation will be one ceremony on the field.
