

Advisory Committee Discussion: What information does the Advisory Committee want to collect to inform recommendations?



Before we collect info:

- Share the words we generated as a committee
- Solicit more words

Information to Collect:

- What is unique to us? (geography, etc)
- Semantics What words are important? Are we changing our name?
- Colors- Do we want to keep our colors?
- Imagery (animals, nature, etc.)
- Symbols and phrases that are meaningful
- Realistic or fictional?
- Actual or aspirational?
- Categories of images/mascots to solicit ideas

What methods will be utilized to gather information and insights?



Methods to Collect and Share information:

- Educate students first before survey/feedback (explain the why and what it means)
- Survey students first and share outcomes to community for input (ex: 80% of students surveyed want a realistic image...)
- Google forms
- Paper and pencil survey
- QR codes
- Posters, flyers idea drop box at school and public places (Mimi's, library, medical offices, etc)
- Invite all members to share ideas
- Social media
- Remind
- Newsletter
- Drop box/suggestion box
- Postcard with opportunity to return ideas
- FAQ document

What Information, Feedback, & Insights does the Advisory Committee want to collect from All Stakeholder Groups?

Information, Feedback, & Insights Advisory Committee Needs from All Stakeholder Groups

- What does the Advisory Committee want to know?
- Categories for Information, Feedback, & Insights
 - Items within the Categories
- Generate Questions for Surveys, Forums, etc...



What does the Advisory Committee want to know/do?

- Could we invite someone from the historical society to be part of the committee to provide info about our history?
- On our survey, can we provide the historical context for our categories? (for example: are the red and green colors related to our Italian immigrant history?)
- What does the image tell us?
- Is it just an image or does it tell a story?
- What would the brainstorm process look like? How can we generate ideas for consideration? Principals or other leaders present to students to begin the ideas.



What does the Advisory Committee want to know/do?

- Create a survey to determine which block F we should use
- We want students to start putting out brainstorm ideas for the name.
- Be sure to explain the "why."



Questions to pose:

- Do we want to change the colors or keep them?
 - o If change, what colors?
- Should our image be realistic, fictional, or conceptual?
- Should the image be related to Fulton's history or a future-oriented concept?





Next Steps
